Familial Alzheimer ' s disease is a very rare genetic condition, caused by a mutation in one of several genes.

As Alzheimer's disease gets worse, the person may have trouble walking and keeping his or her balance. He or she also may have changes in depth perception, which is the ability to understand distances. For example, someone with Alzheimer's may try to step down when walking from a carpeted to a tile floor. This puts him or her at risk for falls.

Alzheimer ' s disease is the most common form of dementia (around 60% of diagnoses in the UK), although it is comparatively rare for under-65s. What causes Alzheimer ' s disease? The exact cause is unknown but we do know that ' plaques ' and ' tangles ' form in the brain due to two proteins called amyloid (plaques) and tau (tangles).

Dementia is a collection of symptoms that are caused by disorders affecting the brain. It affects thinking, behaviour, and your ability to do normal tasks. About 7 in 10 people with dementia have Alzheimer ' s disease. While the exact cause is unknown, the risk of developing Alzheimer ' s disease may be increased by a range of factors, including:

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
